

## What are the European solidarity work camps?

Every year from June to October, certain European groups host volunteers aged 18 and over for stays lasting between one week and two months.

It is also the chance for men and women from different backgrounds to get to know one another. During their stay, European volunteers are integrated into the group and take part in its daily life. They get involved in the activities : collecting, salvaging, recycling, selling goods and in the life of the community depending on their skills, eating with the companions and cleaning duties...

## **Practical information**

The hosting group covers all of the costs incurred by the presence of the young volunteers (accommodation, food and accident insurance).
