COMING FROM PARIS, take the A13 to Rouen, then follow signs for Calais/Boulogne. Take the A28 to Rouen, and come off at exit 12 'Moulin d'Ecalles'. Head to Cailly/Clères. Esteville is the first village on the right after Cailly.

FROM AMIENS AND ABBEVILLE, on the A28, follow signs to Rouen, come off at exit 12 'Moulin d'Ecalles'. Head to Cailly/Clères. Esteville is the first village on the right after Cailly.

COMING FROM DIEPPE, on the N27, come off at exit 'Clères'. Follow signs to Clères then head to Cailly. Esteville is the first village on the left after Claville-Motteville.


COMING FROM LE HAVRE ON THE A29 (do not take the A150 to Rouen). Follow signs to Rouen/Dieppe (A151). After the toll, follow signs to Dieppe and come off at exit, 'Val de Saône', then head to Clères. In Clères, head to Cailly. Esteville is the first village on the left after Claville-Motteville.

Esteville is located 30 minutes north of Rouen.

The nearest train station is in Clères (10km away).





The **ABBE PIERRE - EMMAUS CENTRE** retraces his life, message and struggles through a wealth of videos, photographs, documents and personal items. Discover Abbe Pierre's private world, by going into his bedroom, left intact, his office and workshop, as well as the chapel where he liked to pray. Discover the combats of Emmaus, today in France and worldwide, where some 320 groups are taking action everyday in nearly forty countries.

A **HOUSE OF LIFE** of cultural purpose, the Abbe Pierre - Emmaus Centre hosts events on issues that Emmaus is concerned with. An educational area and library is also open to school children and university students.

In the summer, take advantage of the leafy park, full of flowers. The centre also provides accommodation to excluded people, who welcome visitors onsite.



At **ESTEVILLE**, you are crossing the threshold of Abbe Pierre's favourite retreat. In this simple dwelling, discover the home of this public figure who spent every day of his life living alongside the poorest people in society. His bedroom alone tells a unique story. It is a reflection of the man who lived there permanently for about ten years - modest and abundant. It chronicles his inner life, his many interests and intellectual and manual work (he built the shelves himself).

Discover how Abbe Pierre, a simple Capuchin, became the initiator of Emmaus and of numerous other struggles. "How's your multinational coming along?" General de Gaulle used to ask him. Abbe Pierre liked to remind people that, "It seems to me that adoration is indissociable from action." He was a great believer and at the same time, a brilliant entrepreneur and innovator.

The death of Abbe Pierre does not signal the end of an era. The Abbe Pierre - Emmaus Centre is living proof of a 'Movement in motion'. Emmaus is going strong - it is still taking action and adapting to the problems of our era and of the countries in which it is working.
